- The chat function will be disabled for all City Council meetings on Zoom.

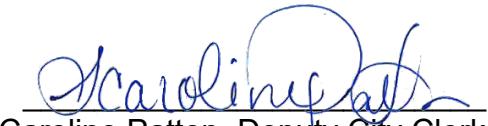
Estándares comunitarios de Zoom para Reuniones Públicas

CITY OF BANNING STAFF REPORT

SUBJECT: City Facility Needs Discussion

RECOMMENDATION:

A motion directing the City Manager to proceed with a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for a comprehensive City Facility Needs Study. Upon review and analysis of responses to the RFQ, City Council will be asked to award a contract and approve a budget adjustment for the City Facility Needs Study.

BACKGROUND:

During the next 15-20 years the population of Banning will grow from 32,000 to a projected 60,000 people. The number of new homes and businesses will create demands on city services and require additional city staff. Now is the time to start discussing and planning for the staff and facility needs. It is also important to note that deferred maintenance and the age of some current city facilities requires action now due to leaking roofs, plumbing problems, and inadequate space.

In 2016, a City-wide HVAC Evaluation (Attachment 1) was conducted by Couts Heating and Cooling, Inc. Most of the HVAC units were rated in a Fair to Poor Condition and all units, except for those at the Aquatics Center, will need to be replaced within the next 2 – 5 years. Repair costs have become a concern as the equipment reaches the end of its life expectancy. Replacement of this equipment is a concern with some of the facilities due to the age of the facilities and need for additional space to accommodate organizational growth and functionality.

Electric Utility Administration Building

The current administration building on Lincoln Street is too small to accommodate the needs of the City of Banning Electric Utility. Plumbing problems and a leaking roof are ongoing concerns with this building. In addition, co-locating Electric Utility Administrative staff with Public Works Engineering, Community Development and Administrative Services will improve customer service and the plan check review process. Ultimately, Banning Electric Utility administrative and engineering staff should be located at City Hall. However, there is currently no additional office space in City Hall.

With the increasing customer base, additional electric staff will be needed to maintain the current level of service. This will include administrative, planning and field personnel

within the Electric Utility Department. Field staff growth can be accommodated in the current space at the Corporate Yard on Lincoln Street.

City Hall

In addition to complete replacement of the HVAC system during the next 3 – 5 years, all usable floor space is fully occupied. City staff has been creative in finding solutions to add workspace, but City Hall is beyond fully occupied. As the City continues to grow, additional staff will be needed in every Department. From a functional perspective, City Hall has numerous problems that are inherent in the building design. The public counter area is disconnected from the City Council Chambers and requires exiting the building to move from one public zone to the next. During business hours, only one unisex restroom is available for public use and the approximately 50 staff with offices in City Hall share one male restroom (2 urinals, 2 stalls) and one female restroom (3 stalls). A small break room with space for four people to eat lunch is inadequate and frequently results in staff eating lunch at their desk or in conference rooms when not in use. All carpet in City Hall is in need of repair.

City Yard – Public Works

This facility is in extremely poor condition with no roof tiles, exposed wiring and exposed ventilation ducts. Facia and wood roof beams are rotting and HVAC requires replacement in 2024. Workspaces have been created in hallways and common work areas. There are currently no planned capital projects for this location.

Fleet/Transit

This facility dates back several decades and is a metal building shell with no machinery or equipment storage areas. Previous City Staff constructed workspaces because none existed. All vehicle lifts are in need of replacement.

Community Center

This is a very outdated facility with limited space for staff as well as public users. Storage space is limited and old showers have been converted to storage. As the community grows, a greater demand will exist for recreation facilities. The current Boy Scout building, Girl Scout building and Aquatics Center are all inadequate and less than functional. In fact, the Boy Scout building is not habitable due to safety concerns. The Senior Center HVAC system needs to be replaced in 2024/2025.

Public Safety

The Fire Station at 172 N. Murray has poor lighting and ventilation in dormitory and equipment bays. HVAC is in fair/good condition with replacement needed in late 2020's. A common bunk area does not provide privacy or security for personnel and personal items. A single shared bathroom is not functional for male and female users.

The Fire Station at 3900 W. Wilson Street is partially used for police storage. The facility is under-utilized, but major repair and renovation would be required for the building to be occupied by City staff. The HVAC system is in poor condition and replacement is needed in 2023.

The Police Station has very limited and inadequate storage space. Police materials are stored in several disparate City-owned facilities. The HVAC system, ducting and filters are located in difficult to access areas requiring revisions. Condensation outlets leak through roofs into work areas.

JUSTIFICATION:

A long-range facility plan is a best practice and provides staff with guidance for replacement of City facilities. In addition, the Plan helps City staff understand major capital financial needs that require substantial funding sources.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Preparation of a Request for Qualifications will be completed by staff. Costs involved will include staff time. Recommended action does not include authorizing a professional services contract or any other expenses related to facility needs.

ALTERNATIVES:

Approve as requested or provide staff with alternate direction.
