

Salary Study Methodology

- Survey data as of June 30, 2021
- Employees completed position description questionnaires
- Consultant performed benchmarking for jobs consistent across the public sector
- Consultant performed survey of other job classes across MOU specified comparables
- Drop the high and low comparables per MOU
- Assess compaction of job grades to ensure proper spacing between employees and management
- Analyze job class structures for internal equity
- Analyze all job class structures as a whole for internal equity



Cleanup Items Expected

- At least one known job class was not adjusted per the methodology previously identified
- Consultant is reassessing to identify any other job classes that may have not been properly identified
- Department heads are also looking for potential job classes that need to be researched
- We will bring a cleanup item to Council to correct (targeted to occur prior to calendar year-end 2022)

The project corridor runs approximately a half-mile, between 8th Street to the west and Martin Street to the east, along Ramsey Street, Hays Street, and Livingston Street.






What will this ATP do?

4. Focus on providing improved transportation choices near schools, parks, and City of Banning destinations





- Analyze existing conditions such as access points, destinations, and physical constraints




What analysis has been completed?

- Completed analysis of collisions of vulnerable road users, pointing to a significant number of pedestrian fatalities spread across the City of Banning





- Existing conditions, access points, and bicycle facilities, showing gaps in the network










