Reports for non-emergency incidents can be made on the Banning Police Department Website: www.banningpolice.org

Examples include: Non-injury traffic collisions, credit card fraud or identity theft, vandalisms and graffiti, and vehicle burglary or tampering.

Reporters will receive a temporary tracking number as a reference until a permanent case number is assigned. Updates on progress and developments regarding the case will be provided via email.

ELECTRIC SAVING TIPS

Summer brings hot weather and a significant increase in air conditioner usage. Unfortunately, air conditioners require a substantial amount of electricity to operate and are typically the culprit of high electricity bills during the summer months. One of the best ways to help reduce the electric usage of your air conditioner is to ensure that your system is operating at its peak performance.

Other ways to help reduce your use and costs during the summer.

~Consider turning off the AC & open windows at night

~Keep the thermostat as high as comfortably possible; Aim for 78 degrees

~Ceiling fans reduce the workload of the AC unit

~Window treatments and coverings help prevent heat from entering the home

~Sealing cracks & other openings with caulk or weatherstripping can also help keep your home cool

MAJOR IMPROVEMENTS COMING TO ROOSEVELT WILLIAMS PARK

Big plans are in the works for Roosevelt Williams Park over the next several months. The park, located in East Banning on George Street and Blanchard Street, just south of Hoffer Elementary School, will be completely renovated with a larger playground area, two basketball courts, a multi-purpose sports field, and improvements to the existing community building.

Security features that will be implemented include LED lighting throughout the park and flood gates that will close off the parking lots at sundown. Bathrooms will be renovated and locked after-hours for additional security.

Construction is expected to begin this summer and will be completed in the first quarter of 2018.



Smart Meters Will Help Improve Customer Service

The City of Banning will soon begin the process of replacing all of Banning's old mechanical electric meters with new state-of-the-art Smart Meters. Smart Meter technology will allow the Electric Utility to do remote meter reading, as well as start and stop service remotely. This means that, in most cases, meter readers will not need to access your property to complete these services. In addition, Smart Meters will ensure the most accurate and reliable customer usage data is being used to process your utility bill.

Smart Meter installation is scheduled to begin this summer and will take approximately six months to complete. A door hanger will be placed at your property to provide you with ample notice of when the meter will be installed at your location - you do not need to be present for the installation as long as your existing meter is accessible.
