Roosevelt Williams Park Improvements

The City will be moving forward with significant improvements to Roosevelt Williams Park, located just south of Hoffer Elementary School.

The new park improvements will add two new concrete basketball courts, a multi-purpose sports field, new playground equipment, and improvements to the existing bathrooms and community building. Security features include gates to close the parking lots at night, as well as dozens of LED overhead lights throughout the park and walking trail.



City Council Meetings Report

The Banning City Council met on March 14th and 28th and took action on several items including:

- Accepted a \$70,000 City Law Enforcement Grant to help fund additional resources to address issues related to homelessness.
- Accepted a grant that will fund the City's Bicycle and Safe Routes to School Improvement Project. This project will add bicycle lanes and pedestrian improvements along several streets leading to schools in Banning. The grant will reimburse the City for 100% of the project.
