City Council Meetings Report

The Banning City Council met on June 13th and 27th and took action on several items including:

- Appointed Alex Diaz to serve as the Interim City Manager. Diaz will continue his duties as Chief of Police.

- Honored longtime employee Rick Diaz, Sr., who served the City of Banning for 42 years. Diaz retired as the Electric Operations Manager and spent most of his career in the Electric Department.
- Approved a construction agreement to begin improvements at Roosevelt Williams Park. Amenities will include new playground equipment, basketball courts, a multipurpose field, and upgraded security features. Construction will begin later this summer.
- Adopted a resolution to upgrade traffic lights along Ramsey Street, which will improve the safety of vehicular drivers, bicyclists, and pedestrians.
